EXPLANATORY NOTES

Council is committed to its "Greening Blacktown" program. Part of this endeavour is to preserve as many of the existing established tree stock as is practicable.

The Tree Preservation clause under the Blacktown Local Environmental Plan 2015 requires Council approval/consent to remove or prune any tree, as indicated below:-

"tree" - A prescribed tree for the purpose of Clause 5.9 of Blacktown LEP 2015 is:

- (a) A perennial plant with a self-supporting stem which:
 - Has a height of more than 3 metres; and/or
 - Has a trunk diameter of more than 200mm or more measured 1.0 metre above ground level



PRUNING

Pruning is the direct removal of limbs and branches of a plant to a predetermined end.

Types of Pruning

- a. **Cleaning Out** The removal of any diseased, damaged or dead branches that could cause a problem.
- b. **Lifting** Is the removal of the lower branches which enable better vision or access.
- c. **Crown Thinning** The selective removal of secondary branches to their point of origin without any reduction in height.

2 CROWN REDUCTION

- a. **Thinning Out** The reduction in height and spread while keeping the plant's natural shape.
- b. Lopping The main branches are cut back to stubs with little regard for its shape and future problems. This is not recommended as it can pre-dispose trees to infectious diseases, sun-scalding of bark, and borer attach resulting in decayed and potentially hazardous trees with a reduced life span.

3. **REMOVAL**

a. The complete removal of a tree, including the stump.
