Council protects all trees with a height of 4 metres or greater . Residents that need to carry out tree work on protected trees will need to have a valid permit or development consent from Council. The assessment process usually takes 28 working days from the date of lodgement (depending on workload caused by seasonal work commitments). You must complete all sections of this form. Failure to do so may result in your application being returned without assessment .

TPO Protection Requirements

Ashfield Council has adopted a Tree Preservation Order. This TPO prohibits any tree work including the ringbarking, cutting of roots trunks or branches, topping, lopping, injuring, the will full destruction or removal of any tree on any land within the Ashfield Council Local Government Area, except with the written consent of Council. A tree is defined as a wood plant with a height equal (=) greater or (>) than 4 metres, a crown width of 2 metres or a trunk diameter of 150mm or greater.

Exemptions

The following exemptions apply;

The following trees species are not included in this Tree Preservation Order and <u>can be pruned or removed without a permit</u> or development consent;

The following tree work is permitted to be carried out without a permit or consent (only with the written agreement of the tree owner);

- DEAD, DYING or DISEASED The removal of any tree that is determined by an qualified arborist to be dead or dying.
- FRUIT TREES The pruning or removal of recognised varieties of fruiting or food trees
- ELECTRICAL UTILITIES All tree pruning or removal carried out in accordance with <u>Section 48</u> of the <u>Electricity Supply</u> <u>Act, 1995</u>.
- WEEDS All pruning or removal of trees declared a Noxious Weed in Ashfield Council Area.
- TERMITES/WOOD DECAY The careful drilling of a tree to inspect for or to treat, termites or decay, by an expert person.
 DANGEROUS TREES The removal of a tree or other vegetation, within 48 hours following a severe weather event, where the Council is activitied that there is a right to human life an event event.
- where the Council is satisfied that there is a risk to human life or property (see section 6).

The following tree work (pruning) may be carried out without a permit or consent as detailed below and is conditional that;

- all work is carried out according to the Australian Standard Pruning of Amenity Trees (AS4373-2007) and Workcover Code of Practice – Amenity tree industry and;
- ii. that Climbing Spikes will not be used on live trees for any reason;
- ROUTINE MAINTENANCE Pruning of a tree by up to 20% (not lopping or topping).
- HEDGES -The pruning and reshaping of hedges provided such pruning is not greater than 33% (or 1/3) of the canopy
 volume in each Calendar year if over 6 metres in height.
- BUILDING CLEARANCES Minor pruning of branches back to the nearest branch junction, <u>directly overhanging the roof</u> of any building to a maximum height of 2 metres above the roof plane;
- PUBLIC SAFETY Minor pruning of trees (less than 10% of the tree canopy volume or branches with a diameter of less than 50mm) growing from private property overhanging public a road or footpaths for the purpose of removal of a hazard, to a height of 2.5m above ground level (GL) over a footpath or nature strip and 4.5 metres above GL over the kerb and road.



How tree applications are determined?

- 1. The assessment process usually takes 10 working days from the date of lodgement.
- 2. Council will process your application fee, register and forward you application to Council tree arborists.
- 3. Council's arborists will review your information and arrange to inspect the trees. This may also include arranging site access or appointments as necessary.
- 4. The trees will be accessed using the following criteria:
 - i. Was/where the tree/s there first (for-see-ability issues)?
 - ii. Whether the tree/s have amenity or aesthetic value?
 - iii. What are its environmental and amenity benefits?
 - iv. Is it healthy, stable and in a good condition?
 - v. What is its age and life expectancy?
 - vi. Is the tree appropriate for the site and growing conditions?
 - vii. How has the applicant contributed to the issues or problems stated in their application?
 - viii. What reasonable alternatives or compromises exist to the requested work?
 - ix. Has the applicant proposed adequate replacement tree planting?
 - x. Information in a report from a consulting arborist, specialist consultant or plumber.
- 5. A decision will be made and Council's arborists will either request further information (a deferral of your application) or will issue in writing a decision, either a refusal or consent, for the requested work.

Council Policy regarding your appeal rights

You are entitled to appeal a decision (a First Review) on your TPO application within 28 days of the date of that decision. This request should be made in writing. Council staff will review the decision based on the information provided by you the applicant. If you want to provide additional information this to will also be considered. Council's decision on the First Review will be provided to the original applicant in writing.

A Second Review by Council must be requested in writing. This second review is based on the information provided by the applicant in the original application, any new information provided and the appropriateness of the decision made by Council staff. Council's decision will be provided to the applicant in writing.

The details and considerations of the review process can be read in section 10 of the Council Tree Preservation Policy 2013.
